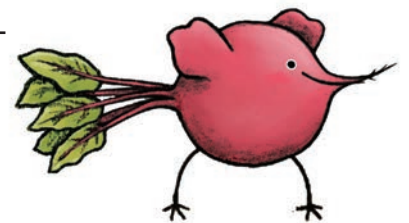
Pugtato Finds a Thing

Best Spuddies Banner

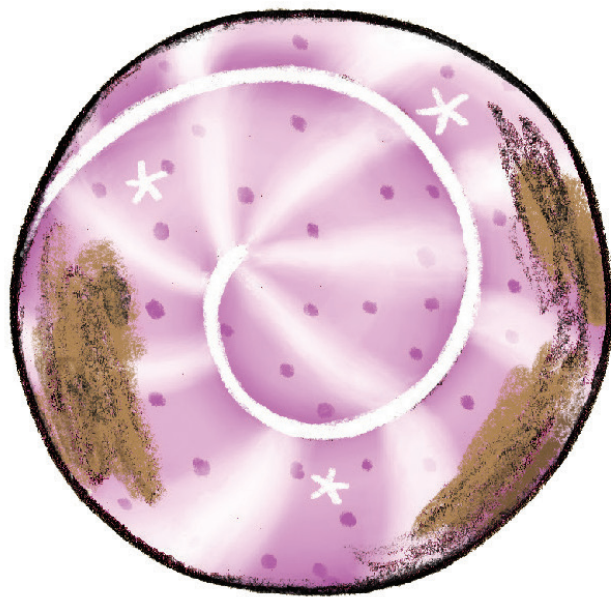
Decorate your room with best spuddies! Cut out the triangles and tape them (points facing down) along a ribbon or string.

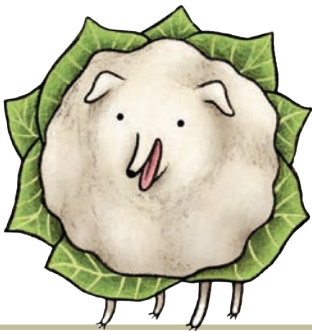
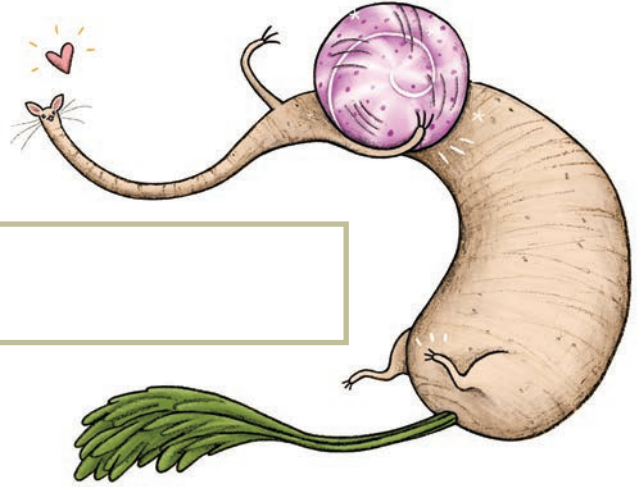
Thing Thoughts
