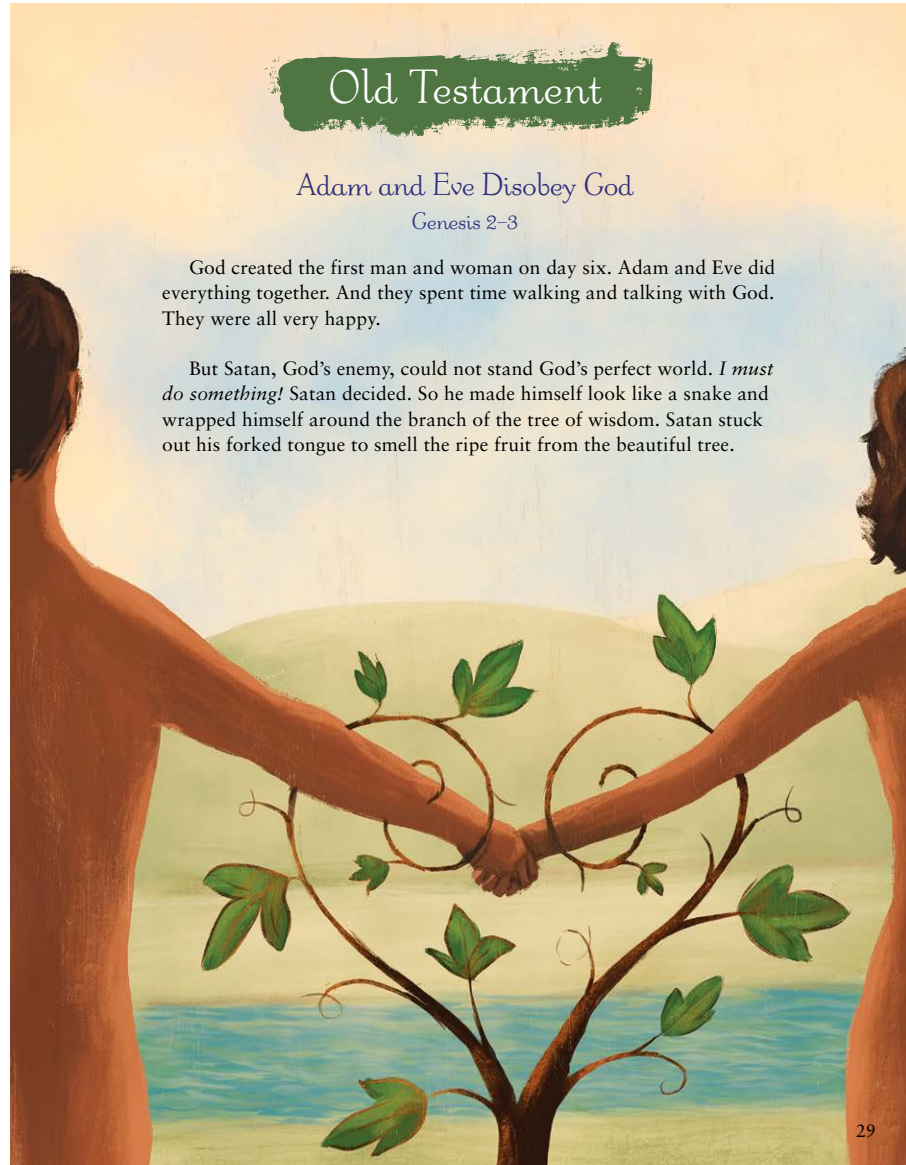
Old Testament

Adam and Eve Disobey God

Genesis 2-3

God created the first man and woman on day six. Adam and Eve did everything together. And they spent time walking and talking with God. They were all very happy.

But Satan, God's enemy, could not stand God's perfect world. *I must do something!* Satan decided. So he made himself look like a snake and wrapped himself around the branch of the tree of wisdom. Satan stuck out his forked tongue to smell the ripe fruit from the beautiful tree.



“Simply scrumptious!” the snake hissed.

Eve heard the snake and asked, “What is scrumptious?”

The snake answered, “This fruit.”

“That is the fruit from the tree of wisdom,” said Eve. “God has said we can’t eat from that tree. If we do, we will die.”

“No! You won’t die,” said the snake. “God is afraid you will gain the knowledge of good and evil. If you eat the fruit you will be like God.”

Eve wanted to eat some fruit, even though God had told her and Adam not to. So she took a bite. “Mmm,” she said.

Adam saw that Eve didn’t die when she ate the fruit. She offered him some, and Adam took a bite. Suddenly, Adam and Eve realized they were naked. They ran and hid in the bushes.

Then God called to Adam and Eve. They did not answer. But God knew where they were. “Why are you hiding from me?” he asked.

“We didn’t want you to see us naked,” Adam answered.

“You have eaten from the forbidden tree!” God said. “I love you both, but you may not live in my garden anymore.”

It was a very sad day for everyone.





The Jump to Jesus

When Adam and Eve sinned, they had to leave the garden. They had to be separated from God. It looked like God's perfect relationship with his children was destroyed. But it wasn't.

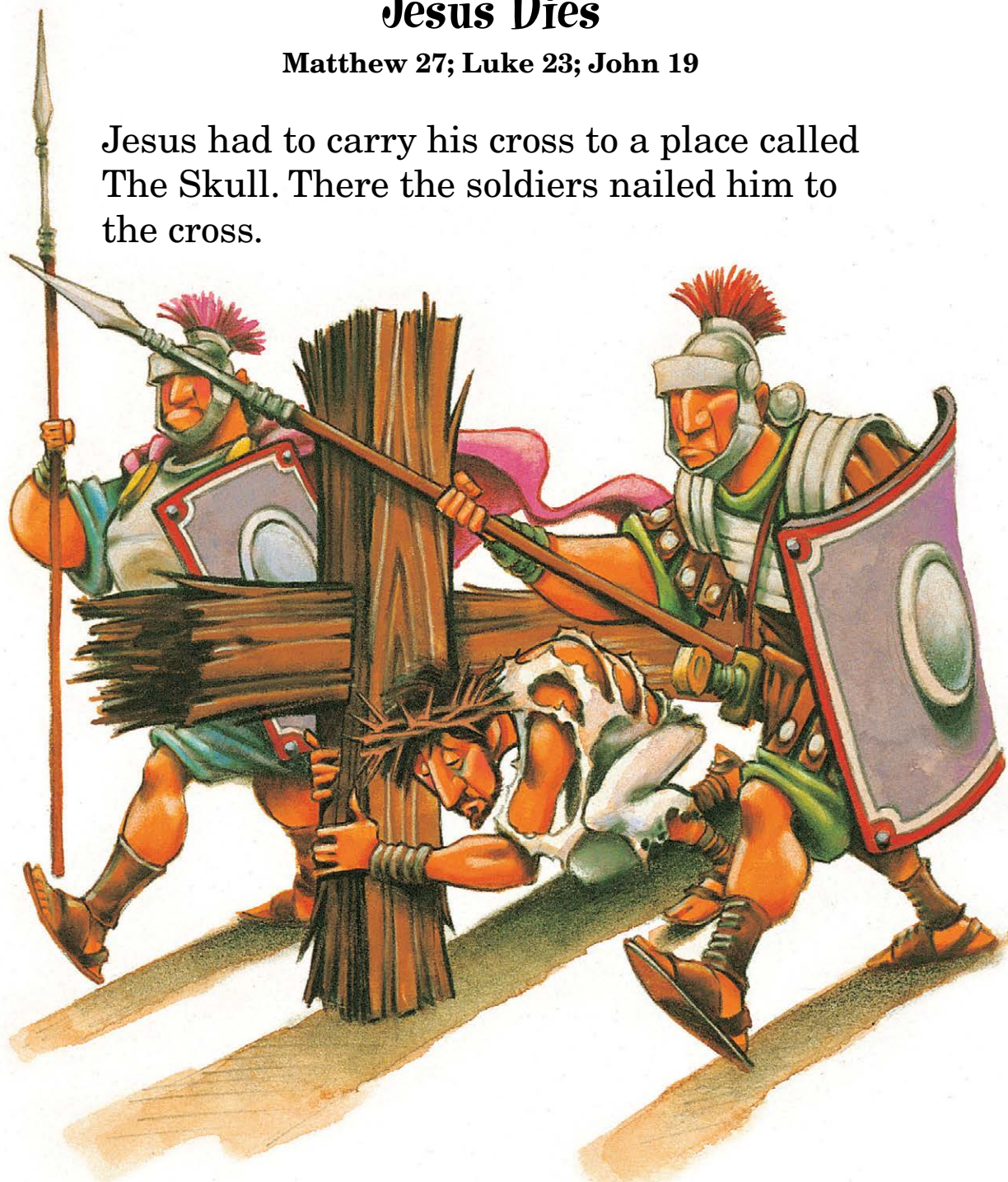
God had a marvelous plan to put that relationship right again. He would show his people how their sins could be forgiven. God planned to send his only Son, Jesus, to die for our sins, to take all the blame on himself, so that we could be right with God again. And that is just what happened. Jesus died on the cross. And three days later, something amazing and wonderful and quite unbelievable happened ...

Jesus Dies

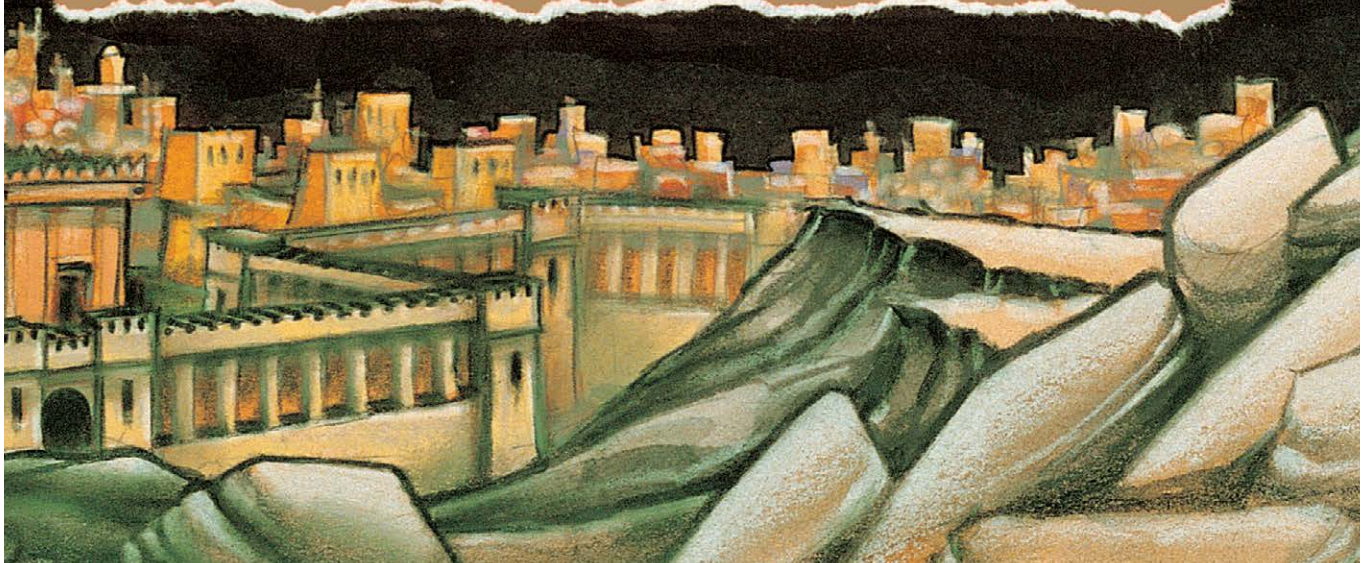
Matthew 27; Luke 23; John 19

Jesus had to carry his cross to a place called The Skull. There the soldiers nailed him to the cross.

Jesus said, “Father, forgive them. They don’t know what they are doing.” A written sign above him read: This is Jesus, The King of the Jews. Two robbers were crucified with him. One was on his right and one on his left. For three hours, the land was covered with darkness. Jesus cried out in a loud voice, “My God, my God, why have you deserted me?” After Jesus cried out again, he bowed his head and died.

Come and see the place where he was lying. ⁷Go quickly! Tell his disciples, ‘He has risen from the dead. He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.’ Now I have told you.”

⁸So the women hurried away from the tomb. They were afraid, but they were filled with joy. They ran to tell the disciples.

⁹Suddenly Jesus met them. “Greetings!” he said.

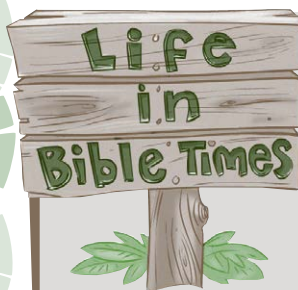
¹⁵So the soldiers took the money and did as they were told. This story has spread all around among the Jews to this very day.

Who is Jesus, and why is he important? This Q&A helps us understand why God sent Jesus to us and what his sacrifice means for us.

Getting to Know Jesus

Who is Jesus?

Jesus is God's son. Because sin came into the world when Adam and Eve disobeyed God, God asked Jesus to come to make things right again. Jesus was born (just about 2,000 years ago), and he lived in a part of the world called the Holy Land. When he was about thirty years old, he began to preach and to heal. Three or four years later he was nailed to the cross to die. When the people who loved him went to his grave three days later, Jesus' body wasn't there. He had come back to life, just as he said he would.

Where is Jesus now?

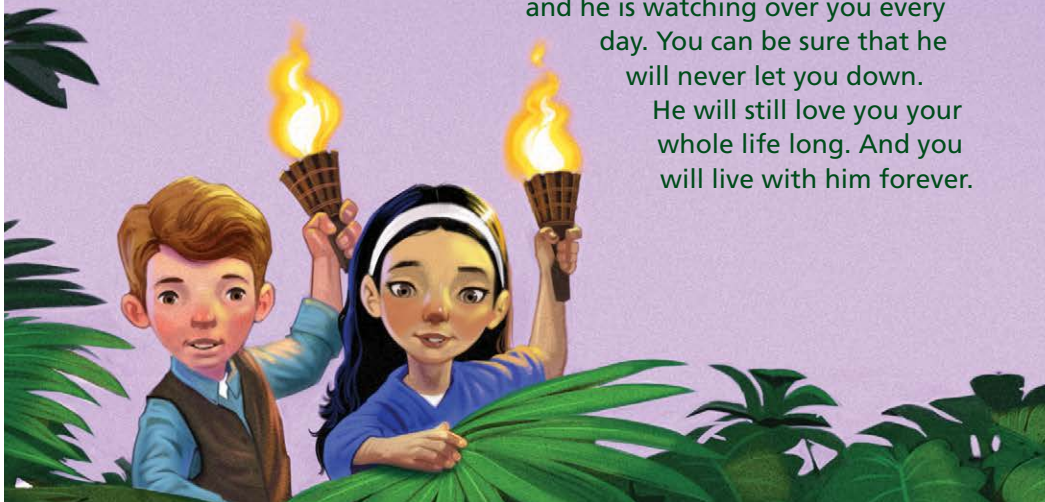
Jesus is in heaven with his Father. But he has not left us alone here on earth. He sent the Holy Spirit with us—to make us strong when we feel like giving up, to help us care about other people when we sometimes don't feel like it, to tell us that Jesus will always love us.

Why did Jesus have to die?

It was all part of God's great plan. You see, we all deserve to be punished. God loves us so much he sent Jesus to take our punishment. Because of Jesus we can know for sure that God welcomes us into his loving arms—right now and when we die and go to be with him.

Does Jesus Love me?

Jesus loves you more than you can imagine. He loves you when you cry and when you laugh; when you argue with your brother or when you've had a bad day. He loves you so much that he died for you—but he isn't still dead. He is alive, and he is watching over you every day. You can be sure that he will never let you down. He will still love you your whole life long. And you will live with him forever.

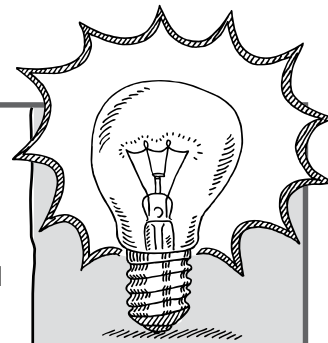
GOT IT!

WHY DID JESUS DIE?

Do you know why Jesus died? It wasn't because anyone forced him. He had a choice. No one could take his life; he gave it (John 10:18). When soldiers came for him, Jesus said, "Do you think I can't ask my Father for help? He would send an army of more than 70,000 angels right away" (Matthew 26:53).

Why did Jesus need to die? God loves us and wants us to live forever with him, so he gave his only son. That way whoever believed in him wouldn't get the punishment we deserved. Instead, we would live forever with God (John 3:16).

We've all done wrong things. Because we've sinned, we don't deserve to live forever with God (Romans 3:23, 6:23). But Jesus never sinned (Hebrews 4:15). He died to take our punishment. He is the only way to heaven (John 14:6). We can't get there by trying to be good (Ephesians 2:8). We need to turn away from sin and trust Jesus (Acts 20:21, Romans 10:9).

Salvation

Pastor Duane prayed with Mark in a corner of the room. All around them was the noise of the youth meeting. Kids were laughing and talking loudly, but for Mark everything was quiet inside. He could feel Jesus' love surround him like a warm glow. Pastor Duane talked softly. "Mark, do you love Jesus?"

"Yeah," Mark prayed, "Jesus, forgive me for being a mess-up and doing wrong things. Tonight I just want to ask you to be with me, and I want to love and believe in you for the rest of my life."

Mark just made a big choice to accept salvation. But what is it? Why do we need it?

God is perfect. He can't ever do anything wrong because he is holy. That makes it hard for God to have a close friendship with us, because he's so holy and we're not. But God's son Jesus came to earth and allowed himself to be killed even though he never did anything wrong. When he came back to life, he took the world's badness away. He made us holy. When we believe in Jesus, God doesn't see the bad things (the sins) we might have done in the past or will do in the future—he just sees somebody he loves. That's salvation! Cool, huh?

Read About It

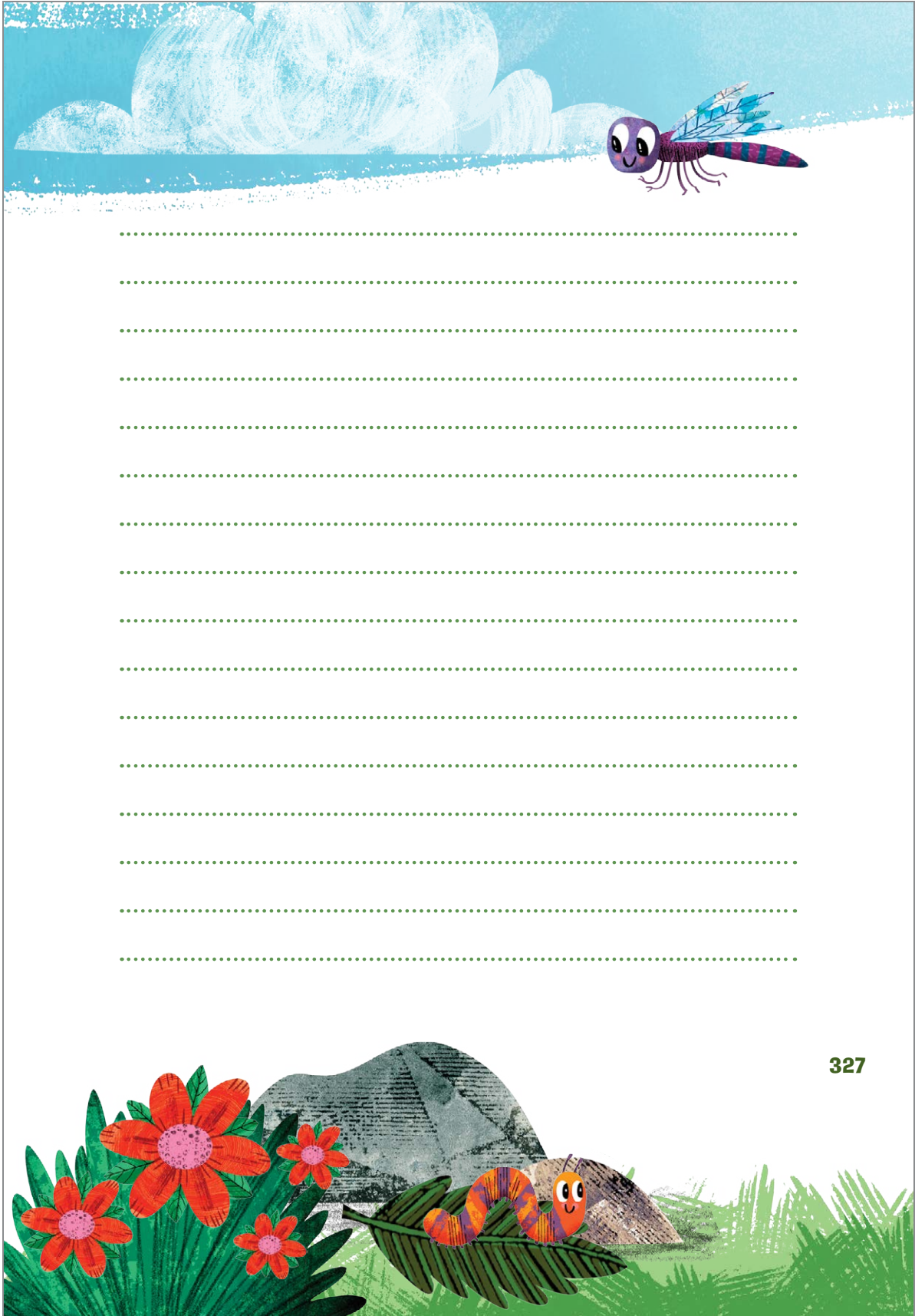
God wants us to keep our attention fixed on Jesus.

If you're like almost everyone, you've probably tripped over something at one time or another. You might have been talking or texting on your phone. Maybe someone left some clothes or books on the floor and you didn't see them. You were looking at something else instead of where you were walking and tripped.

The author of Hebrews is writing to believers. He doesn't want them to trip in their faith. He wants them to pay attention to where they are walking. In other words, he wants them to keep their attention on Jesus. There were some people who were trying to get them to look at the old things they trusted in. They trusted in those things before they trusted in Jesus. Those things included angels, the priests, the sacrifice system, and other Jewish practices. The author of this book wants believers to keep their attention on Jesus instead. He knows that Jesus is so much better than all of those other things. Trusting in him gives us a relationship with God forever. So don't trip over other things. Keep your attention on Jesus!

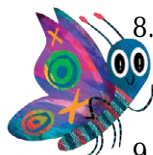

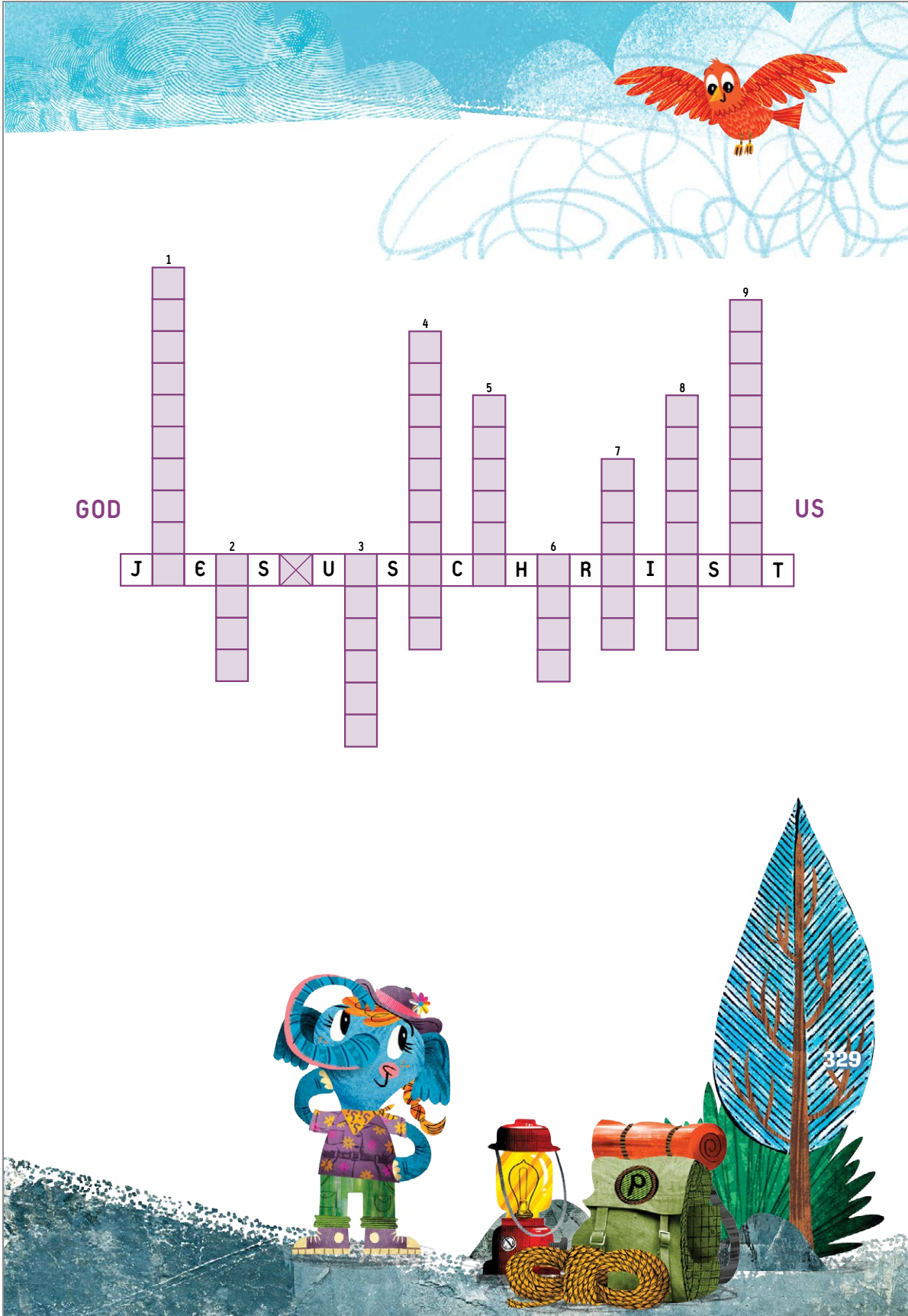

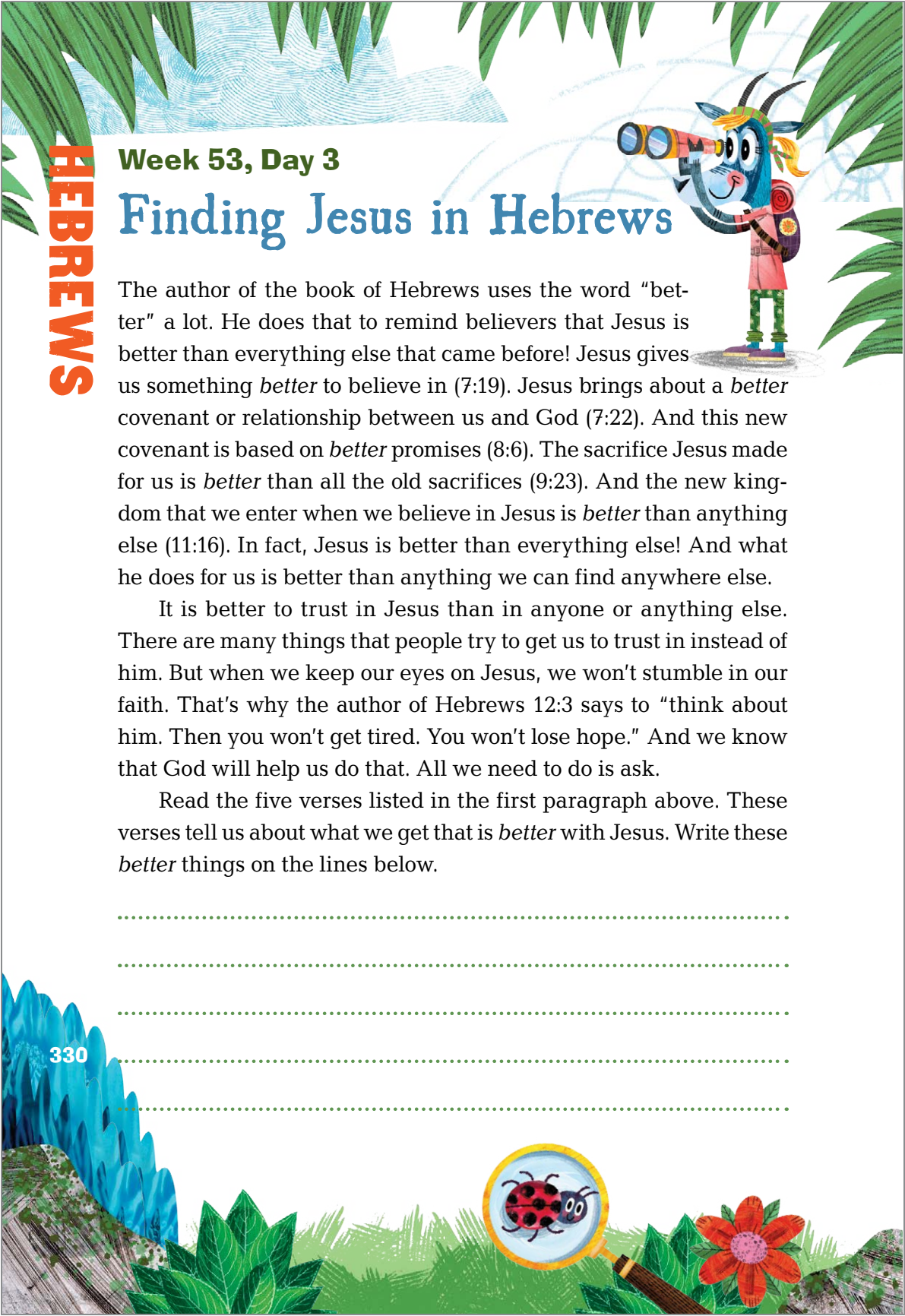

Finding Jesus in Hebrews

The author of the book of Hebrews uses the word “better” a lot. He does that to remind believers that Jesus is better than everything else that came before! Jesus gives us something *better* to believe in (7:19). Jesus brings about a *better* covenant or relationship between us and God (7:22). And this new covenant is based on *better* promises (8:6). The sacrifice Jesus made for us is *better* than all the old sacrifices (9:23). And the new kingdom that we enter when we believe in Jesus is *better* than anything else (11:16). In fact, Jesus is better than everything else! And what he does for us is better than anything we can find anywhere else.

It is better to trust in Jesus than in anyone or anything else. There are many things that people try to get us to trust in instead of him. But when we keep our eyes on Jesus, we won't stumble in our faith. That's why the author of Hebrews 12:3 says to “think about him. Then you won't get tired. You won't lose hope.” And we know that God will help us do that. All we need to do is ask.

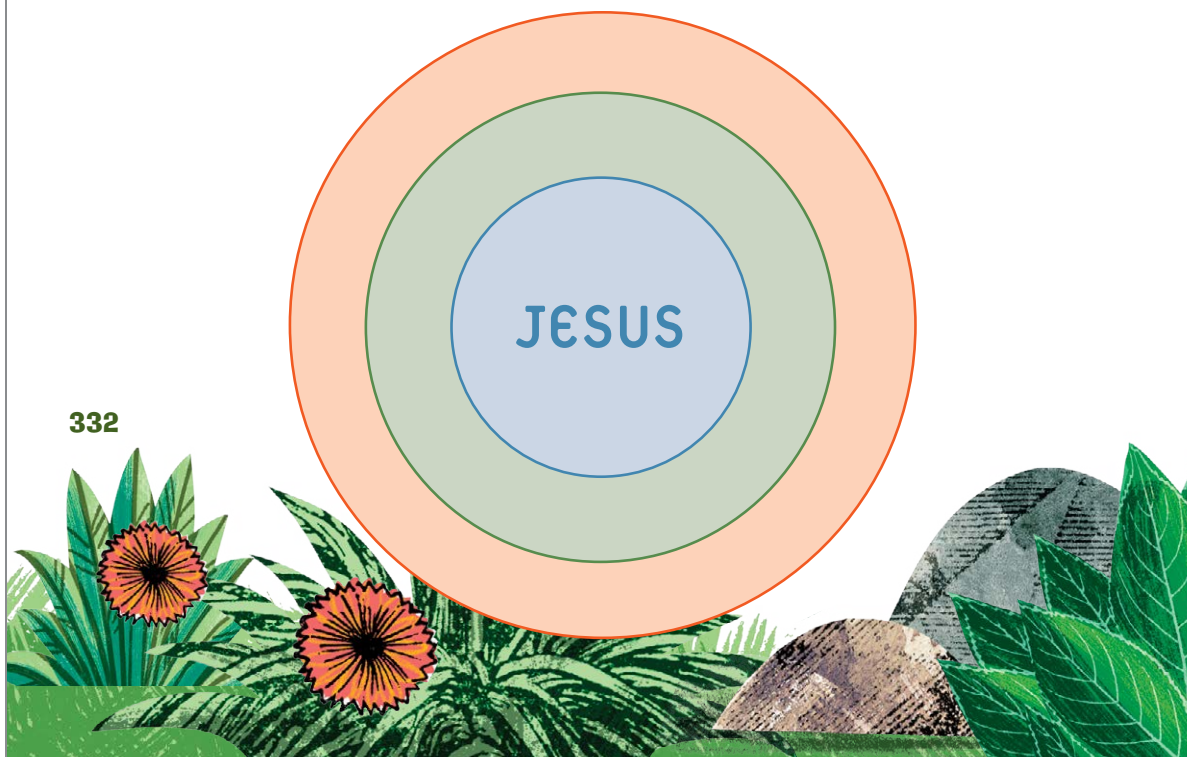
Pray About It

This exploration will remind you to keep your attention on Jesus. Play this game with a few of your friends. You'll need to find a tall pole or a tree. It should be in an open place where you can run without getting hurt. Take twenty long steps from the pole or tree. Then put a ball on the ground at that spot.

Now go back to the pole or tree. Each person who plays the game should run around the pole or tree ten times as fast as they can. Then that person must run as fast as they can to pick up the ball. Someone should time how long it takes them to do this. The person who can do it the fastest wins the game.

It's going to be hard to stay on track. You're going to be a little dizzy! Your body won't want to do what your brain is telling it to do! You might have a hard time keeping your eye on the ball. That's how it is sometimes with your Christian life. It's hard for us to keep our attention on Jesus. Getting dizzy and maybe even falling down a time or two will remind you of Hebrews. It will remind you to keep your eyes on Jesus!

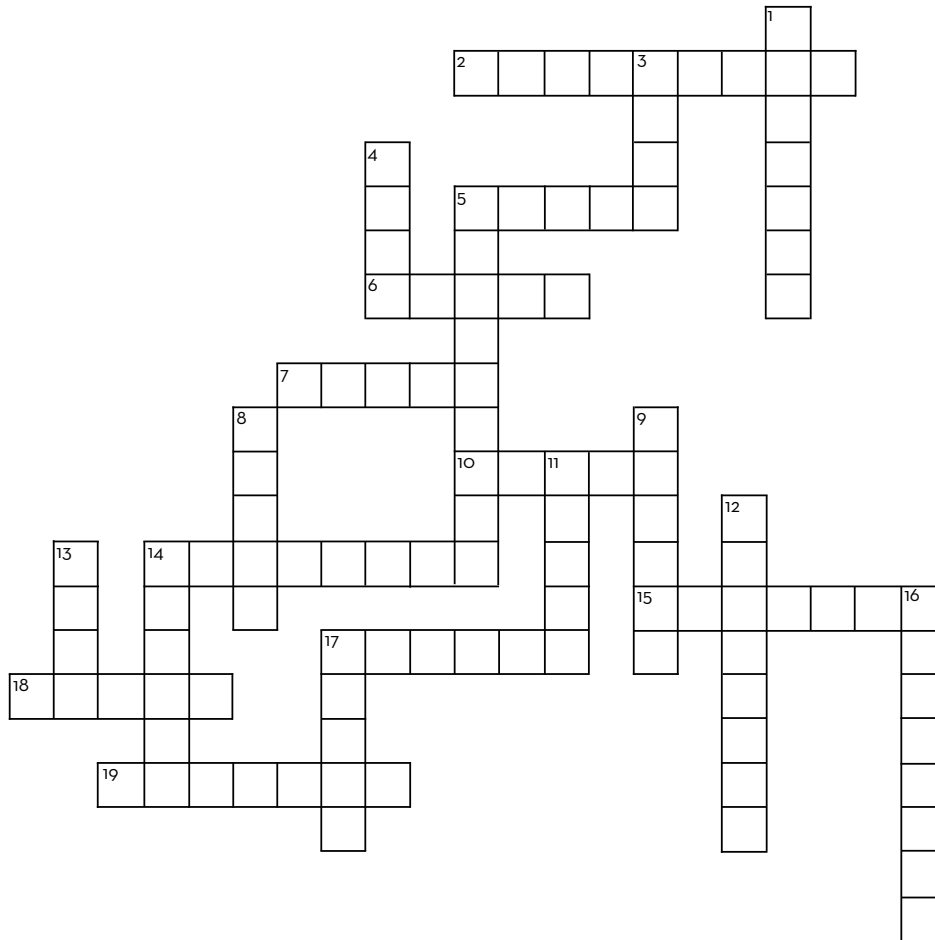

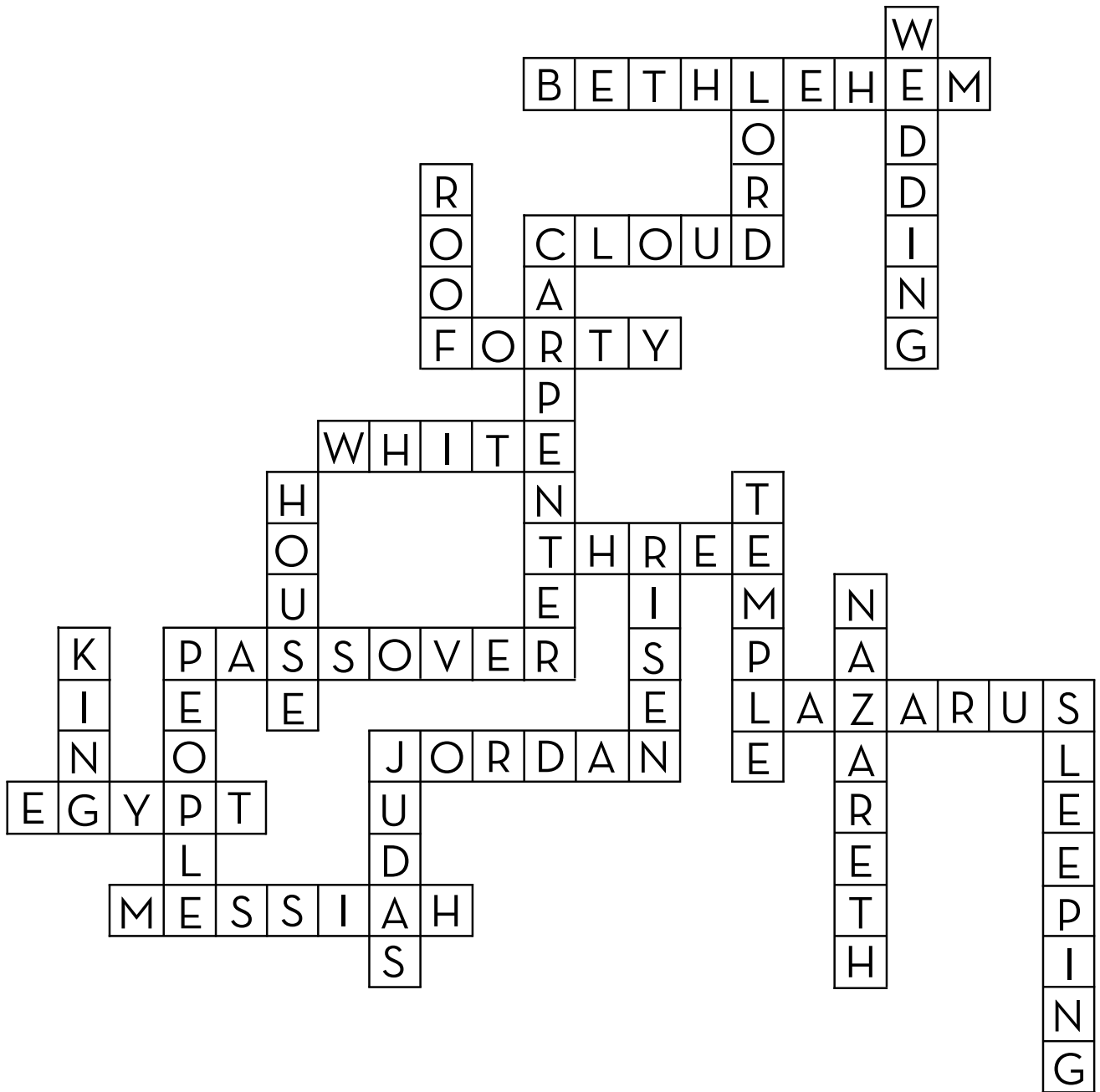
